## Emblem Sales

Dear Mr. Debro:

This past June, the U.S. Supreme Court issued a decision allowing states to collect sales tax on purchases from out-of-state retailers, regardless of the retailers' physical presence within the state. As a result, a number of states have passed laws requiring out-of-state sellers to collect sales tax if they meet a certain threshold of sales within the state. Your state has passed such a law that goes into effect in 2019, and we determined that Emblem Sales meets the established sales threshold. Therefore, Emblem Sales will begin charging and collecting sales taxes on purchases made from your state on February 1, 2019.

So that your Department is not charged sales tax at this time, we will need a copy of the Department's state tax exemption certificate before February 1. That can be emailed to Beverly Maharry, our Financial Assistant, at [bmaharry@legion.org](mailto:bmaharry@legion.org).

In addition, we would appreciate the Department's help in getting the word out about this change to local Posts and individual members within your state, as well as to state leadership at the Auxiliary and Sons. To facilitate this, a list of talking points regarding the change is attached to this email. You can distribute this information in the manner that best suits your Department (by newsletter, web site, email, etc.).
